1. Entries in this class are open to the world.
2. Entries must be in place between the hours of 7:00 a.m and 9:00 a.m., TUESDAY, JULY 19, 2011.
3. NO ENTRY FEE WILL BE RETURNED.
4. Only one exhibit can be entered in each class.5. The superintendents and the judge have the privilege of reclassifying any entry which they think is incorrectly entered.
6. Ribbons MUST NOT be taken from entries until exhibits are removed under penalty of forfeiting premium.
7. Exhibits will be released at 5:30 on the last day of the fair. Exhibits not claimed by 7:00 P.M. will be discarded.
8. A standard bundle for display in this department shall be securely tied but not less than four or five inches in diameter at approximately one-third the distance from the top.
9. Any grain sample showing evidence of being too old or containing weevil or other damage will be excluded from competition.
10. All exhibits must be quantity exactly specified in the premium list (peck, gallon, etc.) otherwise they will be disqualified.
11. All produce should be homegrown. Any others will be automatically disqualified.
12. All exhibitors must call for their exhibits and premium checks between 5:30 and 7:00 p.m. the last day of the fair, SUNDAY, JULY 24, 2011. Exhibits may not be removed before designated time.
13. Separate exhibits required for Department J, and Department J (Jr. Division).
14. All field seed should be displayed in a clear wide mouth gallon jar.
15. All vegetables should be exhibited on white disposable plates with the entry tags firmly attached.
16. Vegetable exhibitors should refer to the "Exhibiting Vegetables" publication that is available from the University of Illinois, Cooperative Extension Service.
17. Failure to follow these rules could cause disqualification.
18. All Exhibitors must purchase an exhibitor's ticket.
