1. Please read the following rules carefully.
2. Be sure your plant is registered in the right category at the fair office.
3. **Be sure entry is placed in the right category before leaving the Floriculture Department.**
4. Entries in this department are open to the world.
5. There is a limit of ONE ENTRY in each class per exhibitor.
6. Vases and containers are to be furnished by the exhibitor. **PLEASE NO ANTIQUE VASES!**
7. Vases and exhibits will be given protection and care until time designated for their removal. Exhibits must not be removed before designated time.
8. The management will not be responsible for loss or damage.
9. Ribbons MUST NOT be taken from entries until exhibits are removed, under penalty of forfeiting premiums.
10. Exhibits of wall hangings must stay until 5:30 the last day of the Fair, SUNDAY, JULY 24, 2011, at which time all floriculture premium checks may be picked up.
11. **All arrangements must be made by the exhibitor, including junior entries.**
12. Entries that have received a blue ribbon in a previous show should not be duplicated in this exhibit.
13. ALL ENTRIES REQUIRE FRESH FLOWERS UNLESS OTHERWISE INDICATED.
14. Accessories are permitted in all classes unless otherwise stated. An accessory should contribute to the design; it is used to establish a mood or feeling; to interpret a theme; to add balance; but must not dominate the design.
15. Plants correctly identified by name will be noted by the judge.
16. HORTICULTURE: Exhibits must be from the exhibitor's own garden. **All specimens must be displayed with some foliage attached. No oiling or dressing of foliage is permitted.** Entries should be free of broken petals or leaves and without soil or insects on leaves.
17. ARRANGEMENTS: **Plant material from any source may be used in the ARTISTIC ARRANGEMENT CLASSES.**
18. The decision of the judge is final.
19. PLEASE NOTE: There are two different days for judging. Choose the class you wish to enter, make your entry for the right class and present the entry on the appropriate day for that class.
20. Failure to follow these rules could cause disqualification.
21. The judge reserves the right to not give top placing if an exhibit does not meet qualifications.
22. All Exhibitor's must purchase an exhibitor's ticket.

- L-1-1 Hosta Leaf (large) 1 over 5 inches
- L-1-2 Hosta Leaves 2 under 5 inches
- L-1-3 Lilies - 2 stems - any variety - (Lillium)
- L-1-4 Lilies - 2 stems - Hemerocallis (Daylily - with or without attached foliage)
- L-1-5 Pansy - 3 stems, same color
- L-1-6 Snapdragon - 3 stems, same color
- L-1-7 Marigolds - French, 3 stems, same color
- L-1-8 Marigolds - Large, 3 stems, same color
- L-1-9 Petunia - Single, 3 stems, same color

- L-1-10 Petunia – Double, 3 stems, same color
- L-1-11 Gladiolus – 3 stems, same color
- L-1-12 Zinnia – any color, 3 stems, may be 3 different colors
- L-1-13 Summer Shrub – Hydrangea – White, Blue or Pink with foliage

**SECTION 2–HANGING POTS**

- L-2-14 Any Variety – in Bloom to be named
- L-2-15 Spider Plant
- L-2-16 Wave Petunia
- L-2-17 Combination planter – more than 3 varieties in same pot
- L-2-18 Ivy – any variety

**SECTION 3–ADULT ARRANGEMENTS**

- L-3-19 “Welcome”: Door wreath or swag all dried plant materials. Must be prepared to hang on door.
- L-3-20 “God Bless the USA”: Arrangement may include fresh and/or dried plant material. Accessories permitted.
- L-3-21 “Be My Valentine”: May include fresh and/or dried plant material. Accessories permitted.
- L-3-22 “Salute to Agriculture”: Arrangement using fresh and/or dried plant material saluting the Agriculture Industry. Accessories permitted.
- L-3-23 “Let’s Go Fishin’”: Arrangement may include fresh and/or dried plant material. Accessories permitted.
